2.	10.13-10.23	Update on Complaints, Enquiries and LGCSO actions Complaints are not decreasing and are currently running at about 20 per month. Responses now completed on time 76%, up from 41%. Complaints are mainly about provision, particularly therapies. The new target for Annual Reviews of 4 weeks will lead to an increase in complaints in the short term as SCC are not resourced to do this at present. Schools and other providers will also have to change their processes to meet the clarified timescales. 		<ul> <li>Agenda Item 5 – Review of Permanent and Fixed Term Exclusions</li> <li>The Committee thanked the witnesses for attending the meeting and for the information that they provided. The Committee commended Suffolk County Council Headteachers and Officers on the work being to encourage inclusivity in schools and to reduce exclusions rates in Suffolk.</li> <li>Recommendations: <ol> <li>The Committee: a) Recommended to the Children and Young People Management Team: i) review the achievement and rates of exclusion for pupils from BAME backgrounds, including pupils from the traveller community, and the reasons for any disparities, and identify ways in which arrangements can be improved for this group of children and young people, including staff training, early intervention, and engagement with families.</li> <li>ii) provide further information on how Suffolk County Council's £1.1millon additional funding to the Family Services 2022-2023 budget, would be used to improve the capacity of SEND Family Services, in particular:</li> <li>to deliver services to support children and families to reduce permanent exclusions and fixed term suspensions.</li> <li>to develop the In Year Fair Access Protocol with school leaders and parent/carers, and establish sufficient support, an inclusive approach, and clear protocols on communications.</li> </ol> </li> </ul>	SCC Education Children Services Sci

<ul> <li>pool expertise and provide support to each other in addressing and meeting the needs of Suffolk children and young people; and improve liaison with families.</li> <li>iii) council services should continue to support the primary school sector to intervene early when children are at risk of exclusion, using the existing networks of primary schools to identify issues and solutions and systematically share best practice in inclusion.</li> <li>communicate to all schools the range of support available to them around early interventions and exclusions.</li> <li>v) continue to enhance the promotion of the Inclusion Quality Mark through various means, including IQM advocates and school ambassadors beyond the 24 schools already signed up to IQM.</li> <li>vi) to explore with colleagues in Public Health the opportunities of developing a Suffolk Skills Register of community volunteers, which schools could utilise to provide capacity for extra mentoring and support for</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>pupils</li> <li>b) requested an Information Bulletin from the Head of Virtual School on the local live data on current exclusions rates in Suffolk, including a breakdown of the number of excluded pupils with an EHCP, SEN support and from BAME backgrounds. The Committee acknowledged that the current local data would not be comparative to national data and was mindful of the impact that covid would have on comparative data going forward. The national 2021-2022 data would be available in July 2022.</li> <li>c) agreed to feed into Suffolk County Council's response to the Department of Education's consultation on Revised Behaviour in Schools Guidance and Suspension and Permanent Exclusion Guidance, by supporting the key change "Duties to inform third parties of a suspension or exclusion expanded to include, for example, social workers and other professionals engaged in support the pupil."</li> </ul>
